FIFTEEN PRINCIPLES OF VIOLIN PLAYING By Ronald Mutchnik Principles of Posture: 1 V-Shaped Feet - No wider than length of shoulders and neither foot in front or behind the other 2 Shoulders Level with Head Straight Ahead - Head and neck aligned on top of spine; natural "C" curve in neck and gentle "S" curve in spine with no lifting/raising in the shoulders and no turning of the

became the head of the violin department at the Juilliard School in 1946 He wrote two violin method books, Principles of Violin Playing and Teaching (1962) and Contemporary Violin Technique (1962) Galamian incorporated aspects of both the Russian and French schools of ...
